

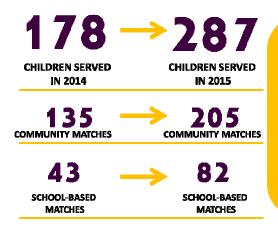


SCHOOL-BASED PROGRAMS

Individual mentoring takes place a minimum of one hour once a week at the child's school during the academic year.



Role models make an impact. National and local studies show that children who have role models are more likely to improve in school and in their relationships with family and friends, and are less likely to use illegal drugs or alcohol. In 2015 we served 287 children. All volunteers are thoroughly screened and interviewed, and must be at least 19 years old.



COMMUNITY- BASED PROGRAMS

Bigs/Littles spend at least 4 hours a month on a regular basis during outings in the community, for a minimum of one year.
